New Orleans was focused, on point, and did a good job of mixing up play between the forwards and backs. New Orleans had the larger pack, so it was able to gain significant ground via successful mauls and punches off the base of the ruck, before swinging the ball wide to the backs. The result was a balanced attack that saw Pat Kennedy, Ross Bellaci (2), Mauricio Urrutia and Ron Brink all touch down for five-pointers.

But Malina pointed toward the pack for the foundation of success. The excellent work of Matt Lytle, Matt Upton, Sean Malek, Wes Eustic and Ben Benvenutti controlled the lineouts and worked the scrums, taking away a lot of ground from the opposition. The expertise of fullback Bellaci, who led the team with two tries, highlighted the backs and changed the game with his speedy counters. Kennedy was also an important substitution, who made his impact known immediately in scoring a try to add to the tally.

"We came out knowing what we wanted to do and we did it," Malina closed. "Right now, we have to avoid the let-downs. We let up a couple of soft tries, and you always want that zero. We also have to be smart as a coaching staff and know when to change out legs. There were a couple of guys who went down late, when we thought we needed them. In these tournaments, it's the same for everyone: It's all about recovery. Tomorrow, we're going to bash the hell out of each other."
